

The club soon started meeting at the Lubbock Women's Club. In 1960, the Lubbock Women's Club board suggested that the club change its name, as its members were no longer considered "junior!"

Heritage Study Club was adopted as the club's new name. As a participating club of the Lubbock Women's Club, the Heritage Study Club continues to meet on the third Tuesday of every month and welcomes visitors and new members.
