THE LUBBOCK WOMEN'S CLUB HISTORICAL FOUNDATION is a non-profit organization which was established to preserve, protect and promote the historical and architectural character of the building. The Historical Foundation provides funds for the restoration of furnishings, grounds associated with the building, artwork and decorative items.

A few recent projects funded by the Historical Foundation include the installation of 2-exterior ADA Automatic Doors, painting of the President's hallway and front exterior doors, repairing and painting the privacy fence by the kitchen, replacing window casings on the north exterior windows, and adding additional lighting and ceiling fans to the Assembly Room and Library. These are projects that benefit ALL of our members.

Funding for the Historical Foundation comes directly from our membership and is independent of our annual dues. As a 501(c)3, the Historical Foundation carries the benefit of tax-exempt status and any donations are considered charitable. Unfortunately, with an active membership of over 650, participation is very low. Less than 5 % of our members actively donate to the Historical Foundation.

We need our members to become more actively involved in giving. Next month we will be launching a program allowing our members to easily participate in donating to the Historical Foundation. Stay tuned.

Dear Members,

I hope you're all enjoying a wonderful summer so far! As we celebrate Independence Day, please note that the Club will be closed from Monday, July 1st through Sunday, July 7th. We look forward to welcoming you back when we reopen on Monday, July 8th.

Important Updates

In light of the ongoing increase in food and labor costs, we need to implement a few changes to our events:

- 1. Fall and Spring Coffee Fee: Starting this fall, we will introduce a \$10.00 fee for members attending the Fall and Spring Coffee, Guests will continue to attend free of charge. While this fee won't cover the entire cost of the event, it will help us manage our budget better.
- 2. Style Shows Fee Increase: Beginning in September, the cost to attend our style shows will increase to \$25.00 per person. Organizing these shows is labor-intensive, taking two days to set up, and the fee adjustment will help cover the costs. We are expanding the Assembly Room to ensure everyone who wishes to attend can do so comfortably. Please note that these events will remain exclusive to members for the time being.
- 3. Advance Reservations and No-Shows: We have had ongoing issues with no-shows for our style shows, with about 12-15 no-shows per event, and only half of these members are paying for their missed reservations after being billed. This not only results in wasted meals but also financial losses for the Club. I kindly ask that if you make a reservation for an event but cannot attend, please cancel by the Friday before the event to avoid unnecessary waste and costs.

We appreciate your understanding and cooperation with these changes. Your participation and support are vital to the success of our events, and we are thrilled to accommodate more members and new members in our expanded Assembly Room.
